- The challenges and the opportunities for tomorrow. Is public transport the only answer? How do we ensure greater use of walking and cycling in our daily trips? Will the car still have a role? Are ITS and other technologies the saviour?
- Traffic sustainability and what it will mean for Australian cities and country areas

- What do we do with our current infrastructure? How can we optimise its use and worth?
- Changing driver behaviour for a better future. Will smart travel produce a better future with smarter vehicles and infrastructure?
- Is there a better way to move freight? What are the supply chains of tomorrow? What are the constraints?
- Traffic enforcement and regulation for tomorrow – should big brother be watching? Will technology hold the key to improving safety?
- Skills for a bright future. Where to find the traffic practitioners of the future when we can not find enough now? Preparing traffic practitioners for tomorrow.
