David Raven, Odyssey Energy NZ, - Nighttime Light Performance Surveys

In 1999 a system was developed to measure the performance of street lighting as part of a 10-year Bay Roads Contract for Western Bay of Plenty District Council. It has now been used by over 25 RCAs in New Zealand to survey over 3,500 km of road as a tool for asset management to reduce costs in Councils' operating and maintenance budgets.

Ted Losik, Traffic Engineering Manager, RTA NSW - Practices from a State Government perspective

RTA aims for and achieves the industry best practice in both design, installation and asset management of street lighting. Over the years, the street lighting network has been upgraded to meet its goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and energy bills. Challenges facing the RTA include continuous improvement in all aspects of street lighting and the administration of the Traffic Route Lighting Subsidy Scheme (TRLSS).

Graham Mawer, Next Energy, Program Manager - SSROC Street Lighting Improvement Program

The Southern Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils (SSROC) established and oversees the Street Lighting Improvement Program to implement the recommendations of an extensive review of street lighting undertaken in 2002. There are currently 29 councils participating in the Program from southern Sydney through to the Central Coast and Hunter.

As well as looking at compliance and new technologies, the program has a critical input to the pricing review now being conducted by the Australian Energy Regulator. Prices set this year will be in force till 2014.
