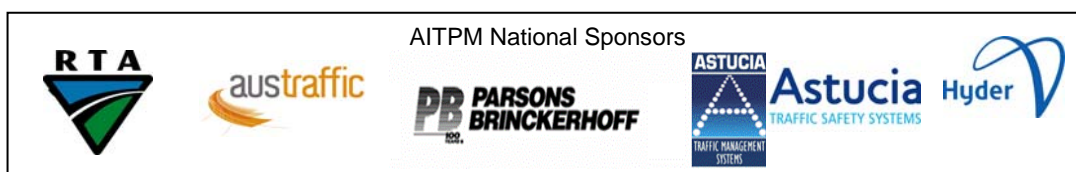
Two of the four corner stones for the Towards Zero Road Safety Strategy are strongly related to Police activities. These are Safe Road Use and Safe Speeds. As practitioners we also play our part by designing and providing safe roads to tie in with the other corner stones. To be effective we need to work with Police in a collaborative way to improve the safety on our networks by tying each of the cornerstones together. You will be enlightened to learn what can be achieved with a simple compliant from the public. This forum will provide you with an insight into the valuable work that the Police undertake and the benefits to our communities. The forum will consist of three presentation as per below.

Speed Enforcement-The Police are in the process of planning the move to digital technology from the current film type cameras that are labor intensive. New cameras are current being trialing, including combined speed/red light cameras that offer a new tool to deal with red light running and speeding. This presentation will provide the background on future directions and what is possible.

Traffic Intelligence-what happens to complaints from councils and residents and information picked up by Police? This presentation will take you into the inner workings of the Police data base and mapping and the benefits to the community. Find out where the burnout activity is, where hot spots are, linkages to repeat offenders and illegal car clubs, the top suburbs and streets for traffic complaints. The presentation will also outline how Police use the information.

Traffic Enforcement-Recent changes to legislation will result in an estimated 15,000 to 20,000 vehicles being impounded each year. Find out why a tougher approach is being taken on hoons and drivers with suspended drivers licenses and the impacts during the first two months.
